

Personalized Learning Spaces

Personalized learning spaces are uniquely constructed to meet the needs and learning goals of individual students. These spaces may look different from room to room, student to student, and activity to processing of content. Generally speaking, personalized learning spaces are flexible and agile, and the user [student] is cognizant of how to manipulate the space to meet their learning needs.

Empowering students to reflect and assess when and how they use personalized learning environments is also important. For example, students should be cognizant of what types of spaces fit for their different needs.

- Working alone versus together?
 - When to make a choice that best supports their needs.
- What type of environment is most comfortable to learn in and does it fit for the type of learning happening?
- Making educated decisions on where they should learn (types of spaces) versus where they *want* to learn (types of spaces) for various lessons.
